## **CLUB MANAGER**

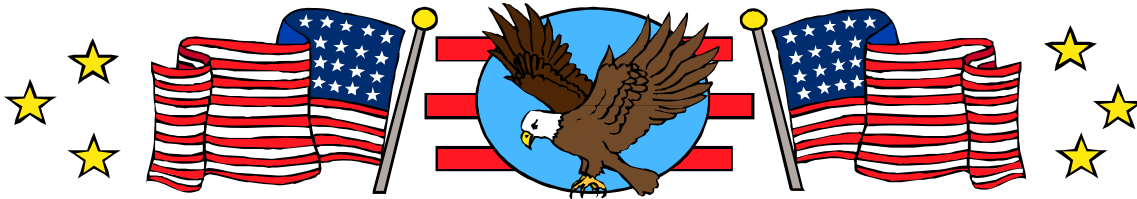

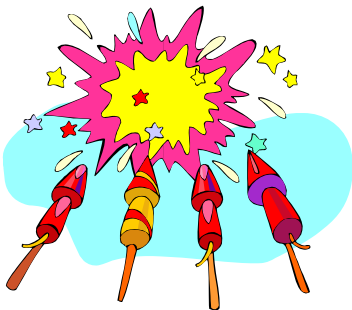


