I Assisted 12 veterans with a wide range of requests during the past month. These requests ranged from requesting a copy of their DD-214 to a spouse of disabled veteran needing information on acquiring special housing adaptations from the V.A.

Please insure that your family and next of kin have copies of your DD-214. This document proves military service. For example, in order to have a flag draped on the casket of a veteran, the funeral home requires a copy of their DD-214 before furnishing the flag. Recently, the families of two deceased vets were almost denied burial flags because of the difficulty the families had in locating the DD-214's.

Educational Opportunities for Veterans

Bal Aguila, retired USN and an academic advisor at Military Education Institute, Florida Community College at Jacksonville (FCCJ) would like to offer assistance to Post 137 members and families in earning a college degree or trade certificate at FCCJ. We have over 200 Program of Studies available for you. The college values military experience and grants college credits for military training. FCCJ offers very reasonable tuition costs, and your VA educational benefits will go further than at other schools. In response to National Commander, Paul Morin's request to activate the Pony Express to help the **LEGACY RUN**, which left Indianapolis, In., on Aug.19th, I, acting as a Pony Express. Messenger, left Jacksonville, Florida on Aug. 18th and rode to Reno, NV., to deliver a donation. My daughter and a neighbor accompanied me.

We arrived in Reno on Aug. 22nd and on Aug.23rd we met the LEGACY RIDERS in Fernley, NV, to escort them into Reno.

The **GOAL** of the riders was to raise **\$250,000.00** for the "**LEGACY SCHOLARSHIP FUND.**" After a lunch at the final stop it was announced that over \$310,000.00 had been raised. Donations from all of the Pony Express rides were given to Commander Morin and the **total raised was over \$400,000.00.**

This was money raised by dedicated members of the American Legion Riders and all of it goes to help educate dependents of those killed in combat since 9/11.
