**APRIL HISTORY**

Col. John W. Ripley, a Legend of the Corps. On April 3, 1972, after U.S. Forces had pulled out of Viet Nam, the NVA opened its Easter Offensive across the DMZ in violation of the cease fire.

Capt. John L. Ripley was assigned as an advisor to the RVN in the 1st Corps sector as a demolition expert. He was to blow up the only bridge over the Cua Viet River at Dong Ha and halt the mechanized forces. Ripley swung hand over hand under the bridge placing explosives along the steel span, crimping the primers with his teeth. It took him 3 hours of backbreaking effort all the while being under enemy sniper fire. As the first of the 200 enemy tanks approached the bridge, Ripley pushed the plunger and moments later the bridge disappeared in a cloud of smoke. The Vietnamese invasion was delayed for several critical days.

Capt. Ripley was awarded the Navy Cross. In 2004 the Marines named the 22nd MEU (soc)'s Forward Operating Base in Afghanistan in his honor. Semper Fi, Dennis Glisson
