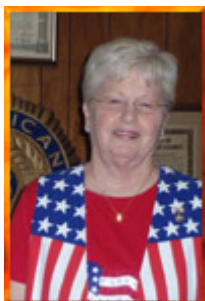

Cabane 304 Report:

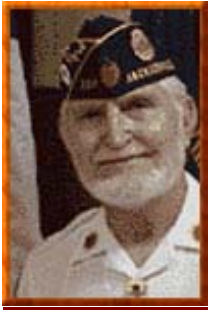

His father, who has helped him since his return to St. Augustine has suffered a heart attack.

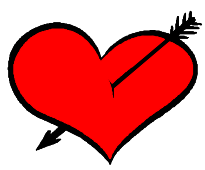
