The Missing in America Program is a group which sprang from the Patriot Guard. Over the past 3 years the MIAP has located the ashes of over 4,000 veterans stored in funeral homes. These ashes are put into boxes or rusty, dented cans and stored in dark, damp basements. Recently the remains of 6 veterans were given the honors they deserve because the MIAP located the relatives of the veterans and the remains were claimed. Among the 6 were the remains of a veteran who had been decorated with 2 Bronze Stars and several other medals for his service to America. The ashes of this World War II Hero sat on a shelf in a can for over 35 years before being identified and claimed. If totaled up the ashes of all 6 veterans sat in the dark, unclaimed, for over 70 years because their final wishes were not made known. Don't let the final page of your life's history be in a can in a dark room waiting to be claimed. Make your wishes known both to your family and in your will. If you don't spell out your final wishes there is a web site you can go to, to see how your wait will be. It is: www.miap.us.
